



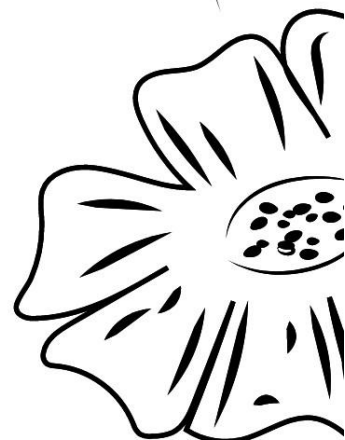

<p><i>Alcea rosea</i> <b>'Black Night'</b> Hollyhock</p>	<p>Deep black-purple, single flowers are produced on tall, sturdy stalks in midsummer. 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<p><i>Bergenia cordifolia</i> <b>'Rothlum'</b> Bergenia</p>	<p>A useful evergreen groundcover for sun or shade. Shiny, leathery, paddle-shaped leaves are green in summer, turning deep burgundy in fall and winter. Bright reddish pink flowers appear above the foliage in spring, an early pollen source for bees.</p>		
<p><i>Bergenia cordifolia</i> <b>'Winterglut'</b> Bergenia</p>	<p>Clump-forming perennial that is a ground cover. Features large rosettes of leathery, glossy, rounded, dark green leaves heart-shaped at the base. Reddish fall and winter foliage color. Part shade to full shade. Prefers average, medium well-drained soils.</p>	<p>H 12-18" W 12-18" Zone 4</p>

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<p><i>Buddleia monarch</i> <b>'Prince Charming'</b> <b>Butterfly Bush</b></p>	<p>10" long flower spikes will stun you with their bright cerise, pink color. <p><i>Callirhoe involucrata</i> <b>Wine Cups</b> <b>Wildflower</b></p>	<p>Native, long blooming, perennial useful for its blanketing behavior. Magenta cup flowers attract butterflies but are unfavored by deer. Ideal for retaining walls or borders where they can "spill." Blooms midspring to the fall.</p>	<p>H 6-12" W 6-36" Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Certastium tomentosum</i> <b>'Yoyo'</b> <b>Snow in Summer</b></p>	<p>Flowering is profuse, with blooms that are silvery white, and star shaped. Showy, silver grayish-green foliage creates an attractive ground cover. Does well in poor soil but needs full sun. Blooms late spring to early summer.</p>	<p>H 4-6" W 12-15" Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Chelone lyonii</i> <b>'Hot Lips'</b> <b>Turtlehead</b></p>	<p>Shiny green leaves topped with pink turtle-shaped flowers in late summer and early fall. Adaptable to most types of soil that stay medium moist or wet. Attracts bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. Deer resistant.</p>	<p>H 12-18" W 12-18" Zone 3</p>	






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<p><i>Chelone lyonii</i> <b>'Tiny Tortuga'</b> Turtlehead</p>	<p>Lustrous, deep-green foliage topped with rose-pink 'turtle head' flowers. Red stems persist over the season. Spring foliage of bronze, maturing to dark green. Slow to emerge, in keeping with the 'turtle head' characteristic. Attracts butterflies. 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<p><i>Chrysanthemum</i> <b>'Mammoth Red'</b> Daisy Mum</p>	<p>Bright red flowers with orange undertones and golden yellow centers bloom from late summer through fall. <p><i>Chrysanthemum</i> <b>'Mammoth Yellow Quill'</b> Daisy Mum</p>	<p>Semi-double, bright yellow flowers with unique spoon-shaped ray florets. Blooms late summer. Selected for their hardiness, vigor, and mammoth size.</p>	<p>H 14" W 20" Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Cimicifuga ramosa</i> <b>'Hillside Black Beauty'</b></p>	<p>Though the young foliage tends to be green, it quickly deepens to an almost iridescent purple black. 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<p><i>Coreopsis grandiflora</i> <b>'Enchanted Evening Tickseed'</b></p>	<p>Naturally dwarf, for smaller borders or containers. Bicolor petals are dark yellow at tips with rich red-orange bases around golden centers. Strong, tall stems hold these well above the ground and its divided dark-green mounded foliage. Full or partial sun and fertile, moist, but well-drained soils. **Planting Trees and Shrubs**

General Instructions

Make the hole twice as wide as the pot or root ball. Make the hole sufficiently deep to allow a 3-4" deep watering basin. Carefully set the plant in the hole, keeping the soil intact around the roots. The root system is the plant's lifeline so manage with care. Do not bury too deep. Make sure the graft on any grafted plant is 1" above the soil line, except for roses. **Add water** and fill your hole with topsoil. Saturate the plant during and after planting, **leaving no air pockets**. Fill hole 3-4 times to adequately soak the roots. **Thorough watering is critical currently**. Place mulch in the basin or over the entire bed for the purpose of retaining water, retarding weeds, and providing insulation.

Water and fertilizer are the secret to making plants grow. Apply only at the recommended rates and times. Do not over fertilize. Please check your newly planted plant daily. Water at least every other day for the first two weeks and when temperatures are extremely hot. Then water two or three times a week or as needed. Clay soils will not require as much water. A finger test works well to check the moisture level, or we have an inexpensive moisture meter available in our store. Most of the young plants that die do so because of lack of water, too much water, or improper planting.

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

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

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
