Clusters of 2-inch, bell-shaped, pink flowers grow off spreading foliage. Red berries follow the blooms that last into winter. In the fall, foliage changes to a red-gold tint. <p><i>Bergenia cordifolia</i> <b>'Rothlum'</b> <b>Bergenia</b></p>	<p>A useful evergreen groundcover for sun or shade. Shiny, leathery, paddle-shaped leaves are green in summer, turning deep burgundy in fall and winter. Bright reddish pink flowers appear above the foliage in spring, an early pollen source for bees.</p>		
<p><i>Bergenia cordifolia</i> <b>'Winterglut'</b> <b>Bergenia</b></p>	<p>Clump-forming perennial that is a ground cover. Features large rosettes of leathery, glossy, rounded, dark green leaves heart-shaped at the base. Reddish fall and winter foliage color. Part shade to full shade. 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<p><i>Callirhoe involucrata</i>  <b>Wine Cups</b>  <b>Wildflower</b></p>	<p>Native, long blooming, perennial useful for its blanketing behavior. Magenta cup flowers attract butterflies but are unfavored by deer. Ideal for retaining walls or borders where they can “spill.” Blooms midspring to the fall.</p>	<p>H 6-12”  W 6-36”  Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Certastium tomentosum</i>  <b>‘Yoyo’</b>  <b>Snow in Summer</b></p>	<p>Flowering is profuse, with blooms that are silvery white, and star shaped. Showy, silver grayish-green foliage creates an attractive ground cover. Does well in poor soil but needs full sun. Blooms late spring to early summer.</p>	<p>H 4-6”  W 12-15”  Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Chelone lyonii</i>  <b>‘Hot Lips’ Turtlehead</b></p>	<p>Shiny green leaves topped with pink turtle-shaped flowers in late summer and early fall. Adaptable to most types of soil that stay medium moist or wet. Attracts bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. Deer resistant.</p>	<p>H 12-18”  W 12-18”  Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Chelone lyonii</i>  <b>‘Tiny Tortuga’</b>  <b>Turtlehead</b></p>	<p>Lustrous, deep-green foliage topped with rose-pink 'turtle head' flowers. Red stems persist over the season. Spring foliage of bronze, maturing to dark green. Slow to emerge, in keeping with the 'turtle head' characteristic. Attracts butterflies. <p><i>Coreopsis grandiflora</i> <b>'Enchanted Evening'</b> Tickseed</p>	<p>Naturally dwarf, for smaller borders or containers. Bicolor petals are dark yellow at tips with rich red-orange bases around golden centers. <p><i>Delphinium elatum</i> <b>'Magic Fountains Dark Blue with White Bee'</b> Delphinium</p>	<p>Intense, regal purple-blue hues with sparkling white eyes. A compact mound of deeply cut foliage forms around the exquisite, elegant flower spikes. Blooms early to late summer in full sun to mostly sun.</p>	<p>H 30-35" W 18-23" Zone 3</p>

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<p><i>Delphinium elatum</i> <b>'New Zealand Stars Mix'</b> <b>Delphinium</b></p>	<p>This mix will range in color from white to pink, purple, and blue. <p><i>Delphinium elatum</i> <b>'Purple Passion'</b> <b>Delphinium (Hybrid Bee)</b></p>	<p>Densely packed spikes of deep purple and white bee flowers. Strong, tall stems hold these well above the ground and its divided dark-green mounded foliage. Full or partial sun and fertile, moist, but well-drained soils. Attracts butterflies and hummingbirds, not liked by deer and rabbits.</p>	<p>H 4-5' W 18-24" Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Delosperma cooperi</i> <b>Delmara™</b> <b>'Fuchsia Ice Plant'</b></p>	<p>Tidy, mounded, easy-care with fuchsia-red flowers with a yellow eye. Provides continuous vibrant color, blooming late spring and continuing through summer and into fall. A tough, drought-tolerant groundcover or rock garden accent.</p>	<p>H 3" W 18" Zone 3</p>
